DARK ENLIGHTENMENT

The notion of "Dark Enlightenment" refers to a movement of thought known as "neoreactionary". This current of thought, spearheaded by theorist and blogger Curtis Yarvin, is characterized by strong anti-democratic, anti-egalitarian and anti-progressive positions.

Dark Enlightenment is based on a return to a traditional society in its functioning and values, and a hierarchy between individuals in their social identities and functions. Moreover, this movement is based on a conception and exercise of power as extremely strong and centralized around a person who can be embodied in a monarchical and ultracapitalist model.

This movement emerged marginally in the mid-2000s and in the online space, but has taken on a much greater dimension in recent years and until recently in the context of Donald Trump's election. Indeed, the **neoreactionary** current has found support and resonance from figures in the American political sphere, such as Vice President J.D. Vance, in the media sphere with TV host Tucker Carlson, and in the techno-billionaire sphere with PayPal co-founder Peter Thiel.

TO SUM UP

"Dark Enlightenment" or "neoreaction" is a antidemocratic, anti-egalitarian and anti-progressive movement of thought. This movement emerged in the mid-2000s and in the online space, it strengthen today with the Silicon Valley's tech leaders and the Trump administration.
